1. Title IV, Part A (Student Support & Academic Enrichment)

Link Crew/WEB is not just 'orientation.' It is an evidence-based **peer-to-peer mental health and anti-bullying intervention**. It meets the direct criteria for Title IV spending on school climate.

2. State-Level "Mental Health & Wellness" Grants

This training equips upperclassmen to serve as frontline support for student mental health, reducing isolation and anxiety for incoming students.

3. Dropout Prevention & Attendance Recovery (ADA Protection)

If this program prevents just **two** students from transferring or dropping out, the retained State Aid (ADA) pays for the entire training and travel cost. This is an investment in enrollment stability.

4. Department of Justice (DOJ) / School Safety Grants

Peer mentorship is a proven strategy to reduce school violence. Link Crew and WEB Leaders act as 'upstanders' who can de-escalate conflict and improve campus safety.

5. Title II, Part A (Supporting Effective Instruction)
